The City of Oxnard, in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the County of Ventura, will construct **a new six-lane bridge on Rice Avenue** to grade-separate the Fifth Street/State Route 34 intersection and Union Pacific railroad crossing.



Benefits to the Community

Through a grade separation, motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians will no longer cross over the railroad tracks, which will significantly enhance commuter safety.

In addition to enhancing safety, these improvements will also relieve congestion and reduce vehicle emissions, facilitate commerce by improving access to the Port of Hueneme, and enhance railroad operations including speed, efficiency, and reliability of passenger and freight trains.

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This essential infrastructure improvement will realign Rice Avenue approximately 250-feet east of the existing Rice Avenue between Sturgis Road and Wooley Road. It will include a connector road, two new traffic signals, traffic signal improvements at Sturgis Road, Class II on-street bicycle lanes, sidewalk, and accessibility improvements.

Construction Timeline

This project follows state and federal environmental regulations, federal-aid and state-aid funding procedures and right-of-way acquisition requirements. A total of 17 parcels were acquired, including temporary construction easements. After over 10 years of collaborative efforts amongst multiple agencies, construction is scheduled to being in March 2025.



Project Funding
