Memorandum of Understanding

The Ventura County Human Trafficking Task Force is a multi-disciplinary task force that brings law enforcement agencies and victim service providers together to combat human trafficking (sex and labor) in Ventura County. The task force is administered and facilitated by the Ventura County Sheriff's Office (lead law enforcement agency) and Interface Children & Family Services (lead victim services provider).

The Ventura County Human Trafficking Task Force is a multi-disciplinary task force that brings law enforcement agencies and victim service providers together to combat both sex and labor trafficking within Ventura County, a county with a significant agricultural sector that is a well-known environment where human trafficking problems can arise. The task force was created in 2019, with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office serving as the lead law enforcement agency and Interface Children & Family Services operating as the lead victim services provider. The task force is applying for a Purpose Area 2 Enhanced Collaborative Model grant from the Department of Justice's Office of Victims of Crime. The purpose of the task force will be to continue its efforts to educate the public and first responders on how to detect and uncover human trafficking, especially in the area of labor trafficking.

The task force focuses on both state and federal investigations, and since its inception, created a protocol for how human trafficking should be investigated within the county. Prior to 2019, no such protocol existed. Interface Children & Family Services not only provides shelter for human trafficking victims, but also operates the 211 crisis line for such victims within Ventura County.

The United States Attorney's Office is committed to working together with this task force to continue its efforts to combat human trafficking in all its forms within Ventura County. We look forward to aiding the task force in uncovering, investigating and prosecuting individuals who prey on victims within this community.
